
## Alford H. Ottley Memorial Tuition Scholarship Fund Essay

His love for higher education provided opportunities for him to serve over twelve institutions of higher education over a span of 50 years. During those 50 years, he served as Headmaster (Administrator) for Faith Christian Academy, where his four sons, Jason, Jonathan, Jordan and Joel attended.

Dr. Ottley was very instrumental in fostering and promoting education for all students. His motto was:

## Think critically; Speak persuasively; Write effectively; Solve problems!

He personally understood the individual and academic struggles students faced as he often recounted his journey of graduating from high school with honors at the age of 16. He knew that there would be times when students would fail a course or fail in some aspect of their education or personal life. Failure when not properly understood could mean the difference between a student moving forward or giving up! Failure has often been something people have been told to avoid.

However, Dr. Ottley believed that failure is a necessary lesson people learn that allows them to be successful...it is a springboard for achievements and accomplishments. He believed that there was strength in failure! He did not let it define him! He learned that failure, in reality, was a gift because it

made you reevaluate where you are, what happened, and forced you to trust God for how He would use that experience to strengthen and empower you according to <u>His</u> marvelous plans for your life!

## Essay Requirements for students in Grades 1 through 12

- 1. For students in Grades 1 through 3
  - Write or type a 100 word essay, explaining something you failed at and describe for the readers how you responded to that failure, what you learned as a result of the failure, and how you moved forward after experiencing the failure. <u>*The essay is to be double-spaced, and if written, it must be legible.*</u>

- 2. For students in Grades 4 through 7
  - Type a 250 word essay, explaining something you failed at and describe for the readers how you responded to that failure, what you learned as a result of the failure, and how you moved forward after experiencing the failure. The essay is to be double-spaced. <u>*The essay is to be double-spaced, and if written, it must be legible.*</u>

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- 3. For students in grades 8 through 12
  - Type a 500 word essay, explaining something you failed at and describe for the readers how you responded to that failure, what you learned as a result of the failure, and how you moved forward after experiencing the failure.
